

Conventions Concerning Rapier War Point Scenarios

A. Balancing of forces

1. Unless otherwise decreed so, before the beginning of each war point scenario, the generals will organize a head count of the fighters in their armies and report the numbers to the marshal of the day. If the numbers of the smaller army are within 10% of the larger army (EX: Blue Army has 92 fighters, Yellow Army has 100 fighters. $10\% \text{ of } 100 = 10$. 92 is within 10 of 100), then no numbers need to be adjusted. If there is a greater disparity, then the generals and attending royals of both armies are to work out how to transfer fighters to bring the size of the armies into balance.

B. Spear Counts / Projectile Weapon Counts

1. Before the beginning of each war point scenario where spears and/or rapier combat archery is allowed, the generals will organize a head count of the fighters in their armies and report the numbers to the marshal of the day. These numbers will be used to determine the maximum number allowed spears or RBGs or bows/crossbows, for that scenario.

C. Coordination between Marshals and Generals

1. A meeting will be held the first Sunday of the war to validate the war scenarios, clarify any issues, and address any concerns.
2. A meeting will be held 30 minutes prior to each war point to address any concerns for that day.
